



AS WE GATHER

"From Generation to Generation" is the sermon series we began last Sunday as the Holy Spirit called us to teach the Torah, to teach God's instruction, to the next generation. Last week we studied the book of Deuteronomy written by Moses. For the rest of this six-part sermon series we will be reading from the Gospel of Mark. In this morning's Gospel lesson, we discover Jesus being addressed by a Gentile woman. This Gentile persistently asked Jesus to heal her daughter. The Christ received her request and had mercy on her daughter as he healed the girl of her infirmity. This morning, we are called to present the next generation to Jesus to be spiritually healed along with us by the grace of God found in Jesus Christ our Lord.


ECDC News

A Short week for our students as they prepare for school to start in earnest next week. An exciting week for students and teachers as they get to know each other and they anticipate what they will learn in the coming year. Some of our teachers have shifted to other rooms for some new challenges and our other teachers have prepared their rooms and lesson plans for their new students to come and learn. Our Infant Room is busy with new little ones to cuddle and help to walk and talk. Their theme this week, appropriate for the start of school, is the ABC's and 123's. They sang the Alphabet Song and Number Song. Plus they read numerous books about the alphabet and numbers they are preparing to learn. They counted everything in sight including their fingers and toes. Their Bible story was "God Is In Charge of Everything" with Ginnie the Giraffe telling the story. Our Toddler Room were starting their study of the Five Senses with sight. They used colored wands to identify colors, they took an eye-spy nature walk to match new words with items they saw on the walk. They also used their eyes to play peeka-boo. For our preschool rooms, the parents and children enjoyed Open House for the Early Learners and Skill Builders. They listened to the teachers explain their curriculum and goals for the coming year. The children who stayed for day care, are for the most part new, and they started learning about each other, the rules and expectations of the teachers and classrooms. They learned how to walk in the halls without running, how to stay in line behind their leader and how to hold "bubbles" in their mouths to stay quiet. They also got to go outside a great deal to play on the gym equipment and play in the sand. They acquainted themselves with the routine of the room, when they received free time, when they talked about their feelings and emotions. They learned about when they got art time, rest time, book time, movement time and the most important, Bible time. Next week, GSRP will start along with our Preschool classes. LUTHERAN'S WOMEN MISSIONARY LEAGUE NEWS







We need some help. We have had some volunteer positions open up on our Boards and we could use your help. Some of Elders have stepped down and we still need a Treasurer for our church. The Elders Board position is for men only according to our church constitution. "Elders, working along with the Pastor(s), have authority and responsibility for the spiritual welfare of the congregation, staff, and other members. They serve as special assistant to the Pastor(s), in prayer, service participation, group Bible studies, visitations, assimilation, and in meetings with Greeters, Ushers, Altar Guild, Worship, etc. If any Elder has been so empowered by the Pastor(s), that Elder could serve in his (their) stead. The Elders are to perform an annual review with the Pastor(s)."

The Treasurer position has been vacant for some time. The duties are as follows: *The Treasurer shall supervise the bookkeeper(s)* regarding (a) payment of all bills authorized by the congregation, and (b) accurate record-keeping of all disbursements and receipts. The Treasurer shall take steps to assure that all financial records remain the property of the congregation and that all officers and board chairs have appropriate access to such records. The Treasurer will issue financial reports and charts for all of Immanuel's programs to the Business Council; and will be available to explain Immanuel's fiscal status at each Voters and Business Council meeting. The Treasurer will serve as a member of The Board of Finance and will be its representative at Business Council meetings." (Italicized portions are from Immanuel Lutheran Church Constitution and Bylaws rev.
