Jesus' death and resurrection were the themes in all of our preschool rooms this week. All of our preschool children and teachers climbed on two buses and went to see the movie "King of Kings" as an Easter treat. This movie was designed in computer animation fashion especially made for children. It focused on Jesus' birth, his ministry with the disciples, his death and resurrection. The children could talk about nothing else and the teachers were very impressed with the movie's message to the children. This movie does not stay long in each of the theaters that play it, but I know you should be able to stream it soon on your devices. We are blessed with Angel Studios who produce this wonderful children's movie.

Our teachers have been moving forward with preparing their students for kindergarten. The students have been learning the letter "C" by creating a caterpillar and cat face in the shape of a "C". The children have been making Easter Eggs to bring home to their families and they worked on their math skills by measuring ingredients for some delicious homemade Belgium waffles which everyone enjoyed.

Our 3 year old preschoolers enjoyed making more Easter Eggs with paper and scissors practicing their gross motor skills with cutting and glueing. They traced their names to practice spelling their names for the 4 year old room they will be in next year. Miss Barb asked the children to color the picture of the donkey and put hair on his neck and tail from their story last week of Jesus entering into Jerusalem on a donkey. Our GSRP room worked with the parents of the students this week for conferences. Talking with the parents about the assessments for their student. These teachers take children who may not have all the advantages as some other students and help the children develop the skills they will need go forward in their journey through education. Our toddler room worked on their garden study, making bugs and vegetables out of paper which kept them practicing how to make scissors cut and how to get glue out of a container. This room is very challenging for so many reasons. This age group is learning so much all the time. The teachers are trying to show the children patience, understanding, flexibility, love, especially to their fellows students. They are learning to control their bodies and make their extremities do what they want them to do. Big learning skill! We are so blessed

with very patient teachers! Our infant room was blessed with many art projects this week, they made carrots out of footprints, they used paint dots to create the glowing body of a lightning bug and finger paint around the shape of a bunny. Wonderful art projects to send home as keepsakes!






