Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ took children up in his arms and blessed them. The Lord's intent was, and still is, that the church would never rebuke parents who bring their children to meet Jesus. Rather, Jesus desires that the church would always provide access to the crucified and risen Christ in order that both adults and children might receive the kingdom of God. This morning, we come to the end of the six-part sermon series, "From Generation to Generation". We have learned from Holy Scripture that the risen Christ calls the church to teach, to heal, to advocate for, to receive, to provide peace to, and to bless generation after generation with the Good News of the Gospel. Moses made this abundantly clear in his first sermon as recorded in Deuteronomy. Jesus of Nazareth repeatedly made his aspirations to bless the next generation know throughout the Gospel of Mark. May the Holy Spirit bring about and sustain a ministry in our midst in which all seven generations among us may be blessed by God and be a blessing to each other.

### **CHURCH NEWS**

In the **Confession and Absolution**, we confess our unworthiness to stand in God's presence. He forgives our sins and welcomes us into His presence. In the **Service of the Word**, we first hear from the prophets who foretold of Christ's coming, looking for the fulfillment of God's promise to save the world (Gen. 3:15). Then we tune our ears to the apostles and their epistles (letters) teaching the Gospel to the Early Church. Finally, we see the full picture of God's work in the world through the Gospel reading: the teachings and life of Jesus.

The Sewing for Missions group is a sub-committee of Immanuel's Lutheran Women's Missionary League. We have met 4 times inperson this year with a goal of completing 12 guilts for Lutheran World Relief and local care facilities. We are a small but mighty group of 6 and growing. ### **ECDC News**

Beautiful Fall weather this week for our students and staff. Several classrooms were going on field trips this week to Stover's Farm and participated in picking out pumpkins, picking apples tasting apples and apple cider, hayrides and hearing about how Stover's Farm focuses on God. Our Infant Room has a theme of "Autumn" this week. The older children in their room made a fall wreath, they all played in a sensory bin with pumpkins, gourds and ears of Indian corn. They played with empty water bottles filled partially with dried corn to stimulate their hearing sense. They cut open a pumpkin to play with the seeds and membrane, and they colored with paint inside a yellow triangle. Their Bible story this week was "God Is Good" with Zoe the Zebra puppet teaching them. Not to be outdone, our Toddlers were continuing with their study of the five senses. The hardest skill for a toddler to sharpen is their listening skill. They played listening games. went on a hearing walk to identify what they could hear and listened as they painted with colored sand on paper. They also had some new things come to their room this week, two new teachers; Ms. Linda and Ms. Aimee joined Ms. Lindsey as staff in the Toddler Room and two new trucks caused some excitement in their room. Our GSRP room and our Four-Year Old's room visited Stover's Pumpkin Patch and enjoyed the outdoor activities they offered. Our GSRP room went on a nature walk to continue on with their Tree Study, like how trees grow, what seeds or berries they produce, if they keep their leaves during the winter, they compared the way the grow and the way trees grow. They discussed shapes and the properties of shapes like curved or straight edges. They continued to work on their letter board and learning what sound each letter has and what it looks like to write the letter. Our Three-Year Olds explored the letter "D" with creating DeeDee Deer out of the letter. They used pumpkin shaped sponges to paint pumpkins on paper and worked on their glueing and cutting skills. They learned the phonetic sounds for the letters A-E and started to learn their Thanksgiving Song. The ingenious teachers helped our three-year-olds to identify their emotions with spots for the students to stand by which reflect different emotions. Their Bible story was about Adam and Eve and how they did not listen to God and created the first sin. Our Skill Builders worked on the letters A, D, M and S, learning about how the shape of the letter changed when the letter is upper case as compared to lower case. They practiced cutting circles and cutting letters out and creating something from the shape. They talked about making choices and selected class jobs for each of the students in the room. They talked about how important it is to take care of their space and possessions. We are so blessed with so many loving, caring teachers!





"Elders, working along with the Pastor(s), have authority and responsibility for the spiritual welfare of the congregation, staff, and other members. They serve as special assistant to the Pastor(s), in prayer, service participation, group Bible studies, visitations, assimilation, and in meetings with Greeters, Ushers, Altar Guild, Worship, etc. If any Elder has been so empowered by the Pastor(s), that Elder could serve in his (their) stead. The Elders are to perform an annual review with the Pastor(s)."

The Treasurer position has been vacant for some time. The duties are as follows: The Treasurer shall supervise the bookkeeper(s) regarding (a) payment of all bills authorized by the congregation, and (b) accurate record-keeping of all disbursements and receipts. The Treasurer shall take steps to assure that all financial records remain the property of the congregation and that all officers and board chairs have appropriate access to such records. The Treasurer will issue financial reports and charts for all of Immanuel's programs to the Business Council; and will be available to explain Immanuel's fiscal status at each Voters and Business Council meeting. The Treasurer will serve as a member of The Board of Finance and will be its representative at Business Council meetings."
